During 2002 Integrated Solid Waste

- Collected from CSU Academics, Residence Halls and Apartments
- 959 tons of material;
- diverted 10,674 cubic yards of material from the landfill (equivalent to 405 trash truck loads)
- saved 14,184 trees

Integrated Solid Waste Recycled 46.3% of the waste stream in 2002, but the future success of the University's recycling efforts still depends on individuals like you. It's up to you to make the effort to reuse waste and recycle what you can. Please take a moment now to read this brochure. Identify what materials you can recycle and find out where you can recycle them. **It's up to you!**



Commingle Containers

Acceptable Materials:

- aluminum cans
- aluminum foil
- aluminum containers (all empty food and drink)
- tin or steel cans
- glass all colors (drink containers only, not household glass)
- Plastic drink bottles (#1 & 2 plastics only)

Unacceptable Materials:

- Lids on jars
- Plate glass
- Drinking glasses
- Ceramic, porcelain glass
- Light bulbs
- Unclean glass
- Lead foil from wine bottles



Cardboard

Acceptable Materials:

- Corrugated boxes (with tape okay)
- Brown paper bags

Unacceptable Materials:

- Wax-coated boxes
- Gift boxes
- Non-corrugated boxes such as cereal boxes
- Soda, beer boxes
- Pizza boxes



Newspaper

Acceptable Materials:

- Newspaper (in brown bags okay)
- Coupons/Glossy materials contained in the newspaper
- Colored, non-glossy inserts contained in the newspaper

Unacceptable Materials:

- Magazines
- Junk mail
- Telephone books
- Cardboard boxes
- Pizza boxes
- Plastic bags
- Cereal boxes
- Glossy ads, folders, or colored paper not contained in the newspaper



Mixed Office Paper

Acceptable Materials:

- Computer paper
- White paper
- Colored paper

- Carbonless paper
- Envelopes: with or without plastic windows
- Coated paper: fax, brochures, advertisements,
- File folders
- Direct mailings (junk mail)

Unacceptable Materials:

- Non-water soluble adhesives: glues, tapes, labels
- Unbleached paper: cardboard, tablet backings
- newspaper
- magazines
- phonebooks
- wax or plastic-coated paper
- brightly colored paper (dark colors or astrobright)
- carbon paper
- food wrappings
- paper towels
- trash

Laser Cartridges

Laser cartridges can be recycled by placing the old cartridge inside the packaging and box the new cartridge came in. This can be placed with the Office Paper containers, which custodians will take out for recycling.
